Q What is a Be Bold, Go Gold Ambassador?

A A student, parent, or school faculty member who helps organize fundraising and awareness efforts during childhood cancer awareness month (September) at their school.

Q What is the Time Commitment?

A School Ambassadors typically attend 3-4 planning meetings with The Ripple Project director, and spend approximately 2 hours a week planning and executing fundraising and awareness events leading up to September. During the actual events, time commitment may increase for a day or two.

Q Who can be a School Ambassador

A Any student, faculty, staff, or parent associated with a school during the 2026-2027 school year. Applications are requested to collect pertinent contact information and get helpful demographic & testimonial ideas for our 2026 BBGG campaign.

Q What do I need to do to coordinate a Fundraiser or Awareness event?

A Step One: Get & Share ideas with other ambassadors
Step Two: Work with school leaders to choose date(s) for your event.
Step Three: Use the TRP Toolkit to create promo materials and spread the word!
